#### **Approval of Minutes**

Approval of the minutes from the April 10, 2014 Piqua City Commission Work Session, and the April 15, 2014 Regular Piqua City Commission Meeting.

Moved by Commissioner Vogt, seconded by Commissioner Wilson, to approve the Consent Agenda. Roll call: Aye: Fess, Vogt, and Wilson. Nay: None. Motion carried unanimously.

## **NEW BUSINESS**

### **RES. NO. R- 67-14**

A Resolution awarding a contract to Barrett paving Materials, Inc. for the CR 25A Street Resurfacing project (MIA-CR25A-14.87)

City Engineer Amy Havenar provided the Staff Report. The resurfacing project will consist of planning the asphalt, necessary roadway base repairs, adjustment of water valves and manholes, catch basin repairs/replacements, the placement of an asphalt surface course, and the installation of ADA compliant handicap ramps. Two bids were received and Barrett Paving Materials, Inc. was selected for the project, stated Ms. Havenar

#### **Public Comment**

No one came forward to speak for or against Res. No. R-67-14.

Moved by Commissioner Wilson, seconded by Commissioner Vogt, that Resolution No. R- 67-14 be adopted. Roll call, Aye: Wilson, Fess, and Vogt. Nay: None. Motion carried unanimously. Mayor Fess then declared Resolution R-67-14 adopted.

## RES. NO. R- 68-14

A Resolution rescinding Resolution No. R-15-12 and enacting new preliminary legislation with the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) for the resurfacing of State Route 185 within the City of Pigua

City Engineer Amy Havenar provided a brief update on the reason for the change. As part of the Urban Paving Program, ODOT had originally programmed to pave the portion of State Route 185 from Covington Avenue to Park Avenue in 2016. However, ODOT had a plan for another resurfacing project on SR 185 scheduled for later this year between the City's west corporation limit and the Miami/Darke County Line. There will be a portion SR 185 between Park Avenue and Stratford Drive that would be left unpaved as it falls between both of ODOT's paving project. This is the reason for revising the project limits at this time to include this area so when all of the paving is completed, the entire stretch of SR 185 from Covington Avenue to the west corporation limit will be paved, stated Ms. Havenar.

## **Public Comment**

Jim Hemmert, Boone Street, came forward and asked who is responsible for Covington Avenue hill? Ms. Havenar explained that Covington Avenue hill is St RT 36 and further explained.

Moved by Commissioner Wilson, seconded by Commissioner Vogt, that Resolution No. R-68-14 be adopted. Roll call, Aye: Wilson, Fess, and Vogt. Nay: None. Motion carried unanimously. Mayor Fess declared Resolution No. R-68-14 adopted.

## **PUBLIC COMMENT**

No one came forward to speak at this time.

## City Manager's Report

City Manager Huff announced Hartzell Industries is consolidating their plant in Portland, Indiana and moving 30 jobs to the Piqua plant.

City Manager Huff also announced the City Commission will hold a Commission Work Session on Thursday, May 8<sup>th</sup> at 7:30 P.M. in the Commission Chambers.

City Manager Huff stated May 12—16 is Bike to Work Week and encourages citizens to ride their bikes to work. You can register on the City Web Site to have your miles logged.

Friday May 16<sup>th</sup> at 1:00 is the WOTVC Golf Tournament to be held at the Municipal Golf Course.

Friday May 16<sup>th</sup> is also the Taste of the Arts to be held downtown Piqua from 5:00 P.M. to 9:00 P.M. and encouraged citizens to come downtown for an entertaining evening.

City Manager Huff announced the Piqua Police Department has acquired an Armored Transport Vehicle for use by the Piqua Police Tactical team. This vehicle was built in 2013 with only 10,000 miles on it. The only cost to the city is for the transportation of the vehicle from Texas to Piqua, which is about \$5000, but the cost of the vehicle new was about \$730,000. City Manager Huff stated Piqua was fortunate to be selected to receive one of these vehicles, as the current vehicle is over 14 years old.

### **Commissioners Comments**

Commissioner Vogt stated he was glad to see the Kids in the Park proclamation and that the City is promoting the use of the city parks. Commissioner Vogt also stated there are two Bike Shops in the city and encouraged residents to support them, as they support the City of Piqua's various projects.

Commissioner Vogt further stated he has received several calls about the city being dirty, and numerous complaints about the pot holes in the city streets. The Street Department is working on the streets to repair the pot holes, but citizens need to keep their own properties in a good state of repair and keep debris picked up. Helping an elderly neighbor is a great way to help. This is your city and everyone needs to help keep it a great place to live and work, stated Commissioner Vogt.

Commissioner Vogt reminded citizens when mowing grass to remember to blow it back into the yard instead of out in the street where it ends up in the sewers.

Commissioner Wilson stated he participated in the City Wide Clean-Up Day on Saturday May 3, 2014. Commissioner Wilson stated he appreciates Russ Fashner, Jim Cruse, and Brad Boehringer for coming out to help him spread mulch in his area. Commissioner Wilson also thanked all who participated in the City-wide Clean-up.

Mayor Fess stated the few negative citizens do not represent the majority of the positive citizens in Piqua. We all need to work together to make Piqua a great place to live and work. Mayor Fess stated she has heard very good positive comments from the neighboring communities. All the awards the City of Piqua has received shows that the city is working very hard thanks to City Manager Huff, and the residents.

Mayor fess also reminded citizens of the 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Taste of the Arts being held downtown on Friday, May 16, 2014 from 5:00-9:00 P.M., and encouraged everyone to mark their calendar to attend.

Moved by Commissioner Vogt, seconded by Commissioner Wilson, to adjourn from the Regular Commission Meeting at 8:08 P.M. Voice vote, Aye: Wilson, Vogt, and Fess. Nay, None.
