Comparisons by Demographic Subgroups

2015





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Summary

The National Citizen Survey™ (The NCS™) is a collaborative effort between National Research Center, Inc. (NRC) and the International City/County Management Association (ICMA). The survey and its administration are standardized to assure high quality research methods and directly comparable results across The NCS communities. This report discusses differences in opinion of survey respondents by housing unit type (attached or detached), tenure (rent or own) and respondent age, sex and race/ethnicity.

Responses in the following tables show only the proportion of respondents giving a certain answer; for example, the percent of respondents who rated the quality of life as "excellent" or "good," or the percent of respondents who attended a public meeting more than once a month. ANOVA and chi-square tests of significance were applied to these comparisons of survey questions. A "p-value" of 0.05 or less indicates that there is less than a 5% probability that differences observed between subgroups are due to chance; or in other words, a greater than 95% probability that the differences observed are "real." Where differences were statistically significant, they have been shaded grey.

The margin of error for this report is generally no greater than plus or minus five percentage points around any given percent reported for the entire sample (441 completed surveys). For subgroups of responses, the margin of error increases because the sample size for the subgroup is smaller. For subgroups of approximately 100 respondents, the margin of error is plus or minus 10 percentage points.

Notable differences between demographic subgroups included the following:

- Homeowners were more likely to feel positively about community characteristics and services in Piqua. Overall, homeowners gave higher ratings than renters to Piqua as a place to live, their neighborhoods as a place to live, Piqua as a place to raise children and the overall direction of the City, along with ease of car travel, the cleanliness of Piqua, the overall built environment of the city and opportunities to participate in community matters, among others.
- Housing unit type typically did not relate to differences in ratings. A few community characteristics received higher ratings from residents of detached houses compared to those in attached housing, while characteristics related to the economy and a handful of items in the pillar of Governance showed the opposite pattern.
- Where differences were observed by age, respondents aged 55 or older tended to give higher ratings than younger residents in the pillars of Community Characteristics and Governance. This pattern was true for the overall image or reputation of Piqua, Piqua as a place to live, traffic flow, cleanliness, shopping opportunities, opportunities to participate in community matters, the overall quality of City services, the value of services for taxes paid, customer service, police/sheriff services, street repair, drinking water and health services, among others.
- Most responses did not differ by sex; however, men tended to give higher ratings than women for recreational opportunities, opportunities to volunteer, drinking water and preservation of natural areas and were more likely to talk with neighbors, do a favor for a neighbor or attend a local public meeting. Women tended to rate the overall ease of getting around, the overall built environment, fire services, fire prevention and education and public library services more highly than men.
- Few results differed by the race/ethnicity of respondents. Where differences were observed, white, non-Hispanic respondents were more likely than respondents identifying as Hispanic and/or another race to give positive ratings. Specifically, this pattern was observed for air quality, the variety of housing options, the availability of affordable quality child care/preschool, street cleaning, preservation of natural areas, open space, storm drainage, cable television, City parks, public library services and public information services. In the pillar of Participation, Hispanic and/or non-white residents were more likely than white, non-Hispanic residents to use public libraries or participate in religious or spiritual activities and less likely than their counterparts to talk to or visit their neighbors.
- Considering future projects for the City to pursue, some differences were observed in the importance of special events and indoor markets by age, race/ethnicity, housing tenure and housing unit type.
