WOOD STREET LOFTS

The proposed Wood Street Lofts development will be located along the Ohio to Indiana Trail within easy walking distance to downtown amenities. The proposed development will include a mix of 1, 2, and 3 bed units that include the full spectrum of modern amenities. Additional community amenities will include on-site management, a fitness center, a community room with a kitchenette and computer area, and an outdoor playground.

The project developer, St. Mary Development Corporation, is an award winning developer of workforce housing projects. Over the past 28 years St. Mary Development Corporation has developed projects in nine states (Ohio, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, and West Virginia) and continues to own and manage most of the 3,900 apartment units they have constructed. St. Mary Development Corporation has an established reputation of operating apartment complexes that offer an attractive living environment and contribute positively to the neighborhood and community in which they are located.

Construction on the \$10 million project is expected to begin spring of 2020.



ZOLO LOFTS

Plans to renovate the Zollinger building with a mixed-use concept continue to move forward. Slate Development has secured financing to finalize acquisition of the property and have applied for federal and state historic tax to credits to help fund the planned improvements. A key component to the project moving forward was a funding source provided by Imagining and Investing in Piqua (iPIQUA Partnership).

The developer plans to convert the warehouse building into loft style living units on the 2nd and 3rd floors, with a deck area on the rooftop, and co-working space and community market occupying the lower levels. The ZOLO Lofts will provide approximately 20 contemporary living units located along the trail system and the Great Miami Riverway and within walking distance of downtown amenities.

Construction on the \$5 million project is tentatively slated to begin in 2020.

RECTANGULAR RAPID FLASHING BEACONS

With the warm weather upon us, the city of Piqua would like to remind motorists to be on the lookout for pedestrians. One area that is fairly new to both motorists and pedestrians are the installation of **Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFBs)**. The rapid flash beacons consist of a flashing light bar mounted on a crosswalk sign to help alert motorists that a pedestrian is crossing the street.

How the RRFBs operate:

- Pedestrians push the button near the crossing sign when they are ready to cross the street.
- When activated, the beacon will begin flashing alternating yellow colored lights similar to the pace of a strobe light.
- When lights are flashing and/or when pedestrians are present at the crosswalk, motorists need to stop prior to the crosswalk.

- Once all vehicles are stopped the pedestrian can travel across the roadway.
- Vehicles are safe to travel once all pedestrians have passed through the lane they are using plus the adjacent lane, or have reached the sidewalk on the opposite side street (even if the lights are still flashing).

Successful operation of the crossing signal requires cooperation and understanding by both pedestrians and drivers of motorized vehicles.

Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon RRFB

These warning lights FLASH to alert motorists that a pedestrian wishes to cross the street.

Drivers are LEGALLY obligated to yield to a pedestrian in a crosswalk.
